

MARK 3:31-35

31 And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. 32 And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." 33 And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" 34 And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 35 For whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

"I already have a family — why do I need a church family?"

- Jesus isn't replacing your family — He's expanding it. -

Your biological family is where you <u>come from</u>. Your spiritual family is who you <u>grow with</u>.

"The church isn't a replacement for your family; it's the resource that strengthens it."

"I'm so different than the people at church — how am I supposed to connect to people so different from me?"

 That's actually the point. Jesus built a family where differences aren't a barrier they're a blessing.

"You don't have to 'fit in' to belong. You just have to show up and be willing to grow."

Unity isn't sameness. It's **shared purpose**.

"I've been hurt by people before — why should I try again?"

- Every wound in your life came through a relationship but so will every bit of healing. -

Jesus redefined family that day, not by bloodline but by obedience to the will of God.
